The recent revelation of 93 graves at Williams Lake and the current work being done at the Mohawk Institute are reminders that the past lives with us and that the TRC Calls to Action provide invaluable guidance for the future. The Agreement in Principle signed on Jan 4 by the Federal Government, First Nations Child and Family Caring Society (FNCFCS), and the Assembly of First Nations (AFN) is potentially a hopeful step forward. This could be a way to remind the Federal Government that we are watching and do not want this to lose momentum, focus or integrity.
